COVID Orange Light Processes – IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Thank you to everyone who is notifying us that they are keeping their children home when they are sick. Along with COVID, there are other bugs and illnesses in the community now winter has begun.
- One of the difficulties we are having at the moment is distinguishing between asthma, winter ailments, colds and COVID as these all have many similar symptoms. If a child is at school and displaying symptoms or seems unwell, we will contact parents/caregivers about this. With COVID still in the community and now with evidence that some people have tested positive for a second time, we need to be cautious and work to protect everyone.

- 7. Enter your name (optional).
- 8. Submit your ratings and comments.
- 9. If you don't have internet access, school office staff can provide you with printed copies of the policy and a review form.

SCIENCE OBSERVATIONS IN ROOM 15

Last week tamariki in Room 15 were making scientific observations about the absorbency of different substances when oil was applied to them. Once they had made their observations, they had to record what they have seen. Below are some of the observations made by the tamariki.

- Sample D it turned soggy, and the oil got soaked up by the dry paper towel faster than the other samples. Sample D was the most absorbent and fastest out of all the samples. Khloe
- I noticed that when you mix the water and oil, the water sank to the bottom and the oil rises up to the top. Also, when you mix detergent, it has the same effect but there were bubbles on the very top.

- The kitty litter, Sample A, absorbed most of the oil and changed from white to brown. The crude oil looks like 2-minute noodle flavouring. Rylee
- Sample A: I noticed that it kind of looked like bird poop but it also looked looked like cat litter. It soaked up the oil and changed from white to brown. Alivia
- Sample A. the crude oil had these little blue balls in them. The oil didn't just stay still, it moved from the corner. Lee
