# PAID UNION TEACHER MEETING IMPORTANT INFORMATION

On **Monday 27 February** the majority of our teachers will be attending a NZEI paid union meeting to discuss the conditions and current offer for their new collective agreement that is under negotiation. This will be held between **2.00 and 3.00pm**.

Under the collective agreement schools must allow teachers, who are union members, to attend paid union meetings for up to 2 hours each year.

To enable teachers to attend this meeting we are asking parents to pick up their children at 1.30pm **IF YOU CAN**. Please sign children out if they are leaving early.

Children who cannot be picked up will remain at school and will be supervised until the end of the school day. Normal classroom programmes will not be running in the afternoon.

I would like to remind parents and caregivers of the importance of keeping your tamariki up to date with immunisations. There are a range of childhood diseases that can be prevented by immunisation such as Whooping Cough, Polio and Measles and there is a series of vaccines that are offered **free** to babies, children, adolescents and adults.

# MEASLES

Measles is a very serious illness. It spreads through the air by sneezing and coughing.



The first signs are a high fever and runny nose, cough, and red eyes. Tamariki are at risk of measles if they haven't had their MMR vaccines that are usually given at 12 and 15 months.

The best prevention is two MMR vaccinations. If you are unsure how many your family have had, check with your doctor. Vaccines are free for tamariki and adults who have not had two doses.

### MINOR AILMENTS SCHEME UPPER HUTT – available to Stokes Valley residents

A new pilot scheme has launched in Upper Hutt to enable eligible people to access some free medicines from selected local pharmacies for minor illnesses where and when they need it.

# The 12-month pilot is designed to help people with minor illnesses to access healthcare and is available for anyone:

- Under 14yrs old
- With a community services card

#### The conditions that pharmacists can help you with include:

- skin ailments (nits, eczema, scabies, fungal infections)
- eye inflammation
- dehydration (usually from vomiting and diarhhoea).

#### The participating pharmacy locations are:

- Lagans Pharmacy
- Queen St Pharmacy
- Unichem Maidstone Pharmacy
- Unichem Upper Hutt Health Pharmacy
- Unichem Upper Hutt Pharmacy

#### The opening hours and addresses for these pharmacies can be found on <u>HealthPoint</u>.

A pharmacist can provide advice on, and treat, common and minor illnesses with a range of medications. The pharmacist will refer patients to a GP or other health care service if the patient's condition requires it.
