# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

On Wednesday 20 August our teachers will be attending a NZEI paid union meeting to discuss the conditions and current offer for their new collective agreement that is under negotiation. This will be held between 2.00 and 3.00pm.

Under the collective agreement schools must allow teachers, who are union members, to attend paid union meetings for up to 2 hours each year.

To enable teachers to attend this meeting we are asking parents to pick up their children up between 1.00-1.30pm <u>IF YOU CAN</u>. Please sign children out at the office if they are leaving early.

Children who cannot be picked up will remain at school and will be supervised until the end of the school day. Normal classroom programmes will not be running in the afternoon.

# ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

Below are the attendance rates for last week against the Ministry of Education headings. It makes such a positive difference to learning and friendships if tamariki are at school every day.

For tamariki who have been chronically absent they will miss 2 ½ weeks of school each term if they continue with this pattern of attendance.


We are planning on the app being a one stop shop where we can share information about our school, and to make communication between home and school easier for everyone using the app.




# KAURI TRIP TO TEPAPA
