
#### MRS C-WEED AND COMPANY'S SEAWEED PARTY

## How our summer reading challenge works:

- It is free! Tamariki aged 5-12 years can sign up at any Hutt City Library, they don't need to have a library card.
- There are four levels, starting out with bronze moving onto, silver, gold, and pounamu. The number of books and activities increases with each level.
- They keep a reading log and are encouraged to talk about what they are reading with library staff.
- There are fun tasks to complete such as: Have a board game tournament with your whanau!
