COVID Orange Light Processes – IMPORTANT INFORMATION

• It is amazing how fast time seems to have gone. This time last year we were heading into a COVID lockdown and bubble school period. While COVID is still with us, it feels as if we have come a long way since that time. We are still seeing the odd positive



COVID case pop up in our school community and we will continue to monitor this and encourage parents to notify us quickly if they have positive COVID cases in their household.

It is important that we all work together to help keep everyone safe.

- Along with COVID, there is the flu and other bugs and illnesses in the community now winter has set in.
- If your children are unwell or displaying any cold or flu symptoms, we ask that you please keep them at home.
- One of the difficulties we are having at the moment is distinguishing between asthma, winter ailments, colds and COVID as these all have many similar symptoms. If a child is at school and displaying symptoms or seems unwell, we will contact parents/caregivers about this. With COVID still in the community and now with evidence that some people have tested positive for a second time, we need to be cautious and work to protect everyone.
- Our Board has reintroduced mask wearing for staff and students in Year 4-6 classes. We have a good supply of masks, and we encourage them to wear them while in class. This is a way everyone can help keep themselves safe.
- We ask that parents, whānau and visitors to school wear masks while on the school grounds.
