Free Somme Movie Tickets: The ongoing commemoration of the centenary of World War I provides many opportunities for us to come together at key moments to remember the sacrifices made 100 years ago.

One such opportunity is the anniversary of The Battle of The Somme. In partnership with the New Zealand Symphony Orchestra, Wellington City Council and the RSA, the British High Commission will be hosting a special performance of the historic film *The Battle of the Somme*, accompanied by the NZSO.

The film is the first recorded movie footage of war and is a realistic record of the Battle. As a silent movie it was often played to a musical accompaniment. In honour of the restoration of this film, the Imperial War Museum in London has commissioned a new orchestral score, and it is this score that will be played by the NZSO.

The event is being held on Saturday 24 September at the Michael Fowler Centre in Wellington, starting at 3pm. The performance will last about 75 minutes. The film is rated PG would be suitable for Years Six and above with guidance from a parent or guardian.

Who can get FREE curtains: Households that have a Community Services Card and don't have adequate curtains, can get lined, fitted curtains for the living room - and for the bedrooms of children, the elderly, and sick people as well.



How to get curtains: To get curtains, just fill out and return a window measurement form, which can be printed from our website or will be available from Stokes Valley Community House from September 12. We have also enclosed one form, which you are free to copy. The last day to return the forms to Stokes Valley Community House is September 23.

Why get curtains: Good quality, lined curtains are critical to keeping heat in a home and keeping power bills down. Curtains can also help keep families warmer and healthier and help to prevent illnesses.
