MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Kia ora koutou

The Board of Trustees meets once a month to discuss how our Kura is performing and what our goals and priorities should be. The Board has five parent representatives, our Principal and Deputy Principal who is the staff representative.

In our August meeting we discussed the results from Term 2 assessments in reading, writing and maths. The results showed that our tamariki are building skills and knowledge throughout the year. They also showed that writing is the core area we need to continue to concentrate most on.

We discussed how a targeted group of tamariki are progressing. This is a group who are being provided assistance to help speed their learning. Finally, we talked about what we can do to help our boys work well together and to raise their achievement.

Another issue we discussed was reinforcing expectations about positive behaviour. This draws on our KORAU values and CHOICE Theory approach. The reviewed card system is providing more options for managing behaviour. This is helping to make clear what incidents are with clear processes for how these are managed.

Our work on developing a vision statement was another item discussed. We are trying to develop a simple and memorable statement that will have real meaning to everyone at our kura.

Information technology is another area that we need to give more emphasis to. All schools have to introduce a new digital curriculum next year and some of our IT equipment is getting old. We need to think about what sort of equipment to replace it with. We decided to set up a subcommittee so we can do some detailed planning.

We were lucky to have a report back from Di Christenson who has recently returned from her Fulbright Scholarship based at Syracuse University in New York state. Di had a wonderful learning experience as part of a diverse group of educators from around the world. She has returned with new knowledge about a whole range of teaching techniques and professional development ideas.

Lastly, we talked about getting on with planning a new playground to replace the facilities that had to be removed last year. We have a healthy starting point with money that was won by Di Christenson as part of the Prime Minister's teacher prize. Keep an eye out in the newsletter for more information. We are determined to generate a range of great ideas from across our school community.
