SCOOTER SAFETY

Last Monday, all the children in Years 1 to 4 took part in Scooter Safety training. The instructors brought in a large quantity of fold-up scooters which were made available for the 6 classes to use. They also provided helmets for everyone to put on. A wide range of skills were taught, including: little feet, stop slow-stop fast, gliding and indicating.

The children had a lot of fun practicing these skills. They also discussed how to keep safe on a scooter, especially on footpaths where cars crossed into driveways. The sessions were very enjoyable and informative for all. Hopefully we will see the scooter instructors back next year.

YEAR 6 SURF LIFE SAVING

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spent the day learning about water safety at the Worser Bay Surf Life Saving Club.
