Koraunui School Board's Ongoing Commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi

Dear Minister Stanford,

On 26 November our Board met to discuss the recent amendment to the Education and Training Act, and in particular the removal of the requirement for school boards to *give* effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi as a primary objective. While we acknowledge the change in legislation, we wish to state clearly that this will not diminish our commitment to giving effect to Te Tiriti within our school community.

At Koraunui School, giving effect to Te Tiriti is not an abstract obligation for us; it is an everyday practice that enriches learning, strengthens relationships, and supports the educational achievement and wellbeing of all ākonga.

We are proud that our ākonga can safely and confidently explore their whakapapa, engage with te ao Māori, understand our shared histories, and grow as informed citizens of Aotearoa. To step back from this would be a disservice to our tamariki, whānau, and community, and would undermine the inclusive school culture we have worked hard to build.

Our continued commitment does not depend on government policy; it arises from the enduring promises of Te Tiriti itself and from the values that guide our school. Far from being a burden, Te Tiriti provides a foundation for a richer educational experience for everyone.

Therefore, we will continue to weave Te Tiriti throughout all aspects of our mahi here at Koraunui School, and we stand with the many other schools across Aotearoa that remain steadfast in this commitment, now and into the future.
